



EXPLORATION PEAK PARK USAGE RULES & REGULATIONS

The signature features of Mountain's Edge are Exploration Peak, located at the entryway to the community, and Exploration Peak Park, the western theme park located at the base of Exploration Peak. Bicycle trails and walking paths lead up to several vantage points on top of Exploration Peak, offering incredible views of the Las Vegas Valley and of the Mountain's Edge community. Exploration Peak Park has picnic areas, playgrounds, walking trails, replicas of a western town and Indian village, an archeological dig site, an outdoor amphitheater and more.

Exploration Peak Park is a public park under the authority of Clark County Parks and Recreation and secured and maintained by Mountain's Edge Master Association. The park rules, regulations and fees are in accordance with the County's policies. Park usage is on a first-come, first-served basis, with the exception of Special Events* coordinated through Clark County. All activities of the Mountain's Edge Master Association and Focus Property Group receive scheduling priority.

The Director of Parks & Recreation or his/her designee reserves the right to take necessary actions to protect public health and safety as related to usage of Clark County Parks & Recreation facilities and programs. All parties must adhere to park rules and regulations as set forth by Clark County at all times. At the discretion of park personnel, it is not permitted to hold a group function in a park area where such activities conflict in any way with normal park usage.

* A Special Event permit is required to conduct any event when such event affects the normal flow of vehicular and/or pedestrian traffic on public rights-of-ways within unincorporated Clark County. Contact Clark County Special Events at (702) 455-8838 for a Special Event Permit Application Packet.

GENERAL RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Park Hours:
WINTER HOURS: 6:00 am to 10:00 pm daily (October 1 to May 31.)
SUMMER HOURS: 5:00 am to 10:00 pm daily (June 1 to September 30.)
All patrons must leave the Park by 10:00 pm.
2. Parking is permitted only in designated areas. Any vehicle left overnight in a County park is subject to citation and towing.
3. No motor vehicles are allowed or permitted off roadways or parking lots in the park without permission from the Director of Parks & Recreation designee. Bicycle and moped operators will adhere to all regulations governing motor vehicles. Skateboards, scooters, roller blades, skates, bicycles, etc., are not permitted in the water park area and children's play area.
4. Dogs and cats are permitted only under control of a handler and on a leash no longer than six (6) feet in length only and must remain on a leash in the park at all times. No electronic leashes.
NO dogs allowed in children's play area or water feature. Please pick up feces after your dog defecates.
5. Absolutely no equipment, picnic tables, trash cans, benches, etc. may be moved to another area or removed from the park.
6. Trash containers are provided throughout the park. Dispose of all trash in the appropriate receptacles.
7. Fly-fishing/casting practice is allowed as long as no safety hazard is being presented to other patrons.

PROHIBITED¹

1. Consumption of alcoholic beverages.
2. Glass containers.
3. Sale or bartering of goods/services, food and/or beverages
4. Fires, other than those in picnic stoves, grills, braziers, or fire pits provided for that purpose.
NO Charcoal barbecues. **Propane barbecues are allowed.**
5. Excessively loud music from external or internal vehicle speakers or portable radios.
Excessively loud music is defined as music at a level that annoys other park users or park neighbors.
6. Carrying, possessing, or discharging of any firearms, firecrackers, rockets, torpedoes, or other fireworks, air guns, slingshots, boomerangs, or martial arts paraphernalia.
7. Dunk tanks and bounce houses.
8. Camping or lodging.
9. Stakes, tent poles or any item placed in the ground that may damage the irrigation system or landscape.
10. Use or sale of drugs is prohibited and will be subject to arrest.
11. **NO** horses or pony rides allowed in park.
12. **NO** professional photo shoots without written approval from the Director of Parks & Recreation, or designee.
13. **NO** golfing in park.
14. **NO** metal detecting or treasure hunting.
15. **NO** nude sunbathing.
16. **NO** flying of remote-controlled aircraft. There is a facility specifically provided for this activity at the Remote Airfield on the north side of the Silverbowl (Sam Boyd Stadium).
17. **NO** exercising in the water park area or children's play area.

Exploration Peak Park is a unique amenity designed for the enjoyment of all the residents of Clark County.
